1. Health Care Associated Infections (HAI) Time Period: January 2018 through December 2018																													
<p>Health Care Associated Infections (HAI) can be acquired while receiving care in a hospital. HAI's can be related to devices, such as central lines and urinary catheters, or spread from patient to patient after contact with an infected person or surface. HAI's can be prevented when hospitals use infection prevention steps recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The CDC collects HAI data and calculates a <b>Standardized Infection Ratio (SIR)</b> for hospitals. The SIR allows comparison of a hospital to national benchmarks. Benchmarks represent the expected infection rate based on the data submitted.
